# LESSON PLAN LEARNING THE ALPHABET

## Grade: Year 1 Subject: English

# **Objective:** By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- Recognize and identify uppercase and lowercase letters of the English alphabet.
- Pronounce each letter correctly.
- Understand the sequence and order of letters in the alphabet.

## **Materials Needed:**

- Alphabet chart or posters
- Flashcards with uppercase and lowercase letters
- Whiteboard and markers
- Worksheets with alphabet activities (matching, tracing, colouring)
- Storybooks or poems with alphabet themes (optional)

### **Duration:** 45 minutes

## **Procedure:**

- 1. Introduction (5 minutes):
  - Greet the students and introduce the lesson on the alphabet.
  - Show an alphabet chart or posters displaying both uppercase and lowercase letters.

- 2. Letter Recognition (10 minutes):
  - Use flashcards to introduce and display each letter of the alphabet, both uppercase and lowercase.
  - Pronounce each letter clearly and encourage students to repeat after you.
  - Discuss any differences between uppercase and lowercase forms (e.g., size, shape).
- 3. Alphabet Song (5 minutes):
  - Teach or sing the alphabet song together as a class.

- 4. Activities (15 minutes):
  - Matching Activity: Provide worksheets or cards with uppercase letters on one side and lowercase letters on the other. Ask students to match each uppercase letter with its lowercase counterpart.
  - Tracing and Colouring: Give each student a worksheet with letters to trace and colour. Provide guidance on correct letter formation.
- 5. Story or Poem (5 minutes, optional):
  - Read a short story or poem that incorporates the alphabet (e.g., "Chicka Chicka Boom Boom" by Bill Martin Jr. and John Archambault).

- Pause to point out and emphasize specific letters as they appear in the text.
- 6. Closure (5 minutes):
  - Review the alphabet with the class.
  - Ask students to identify a few letters and state their sounds.
  - Summarize the lesson by emphasizing the importance of learning the alphabet for reading and writing.

#### Assessment:

- Observe students during activities to ensure they can recognize and correctly identify both uppercase and lowercase letters.
- Check completed worksheets for accuracy in tracing and matching letters.

#### Homework:

• Assign a simple worksheet where students practice tracing and writing letters of the alphabet.

#### **Extension**:

 For students who grasp the material quickly, introduce simple three-letter words and ask them to identify the beginning sounds of each word. Note:

- Use positive reinforcement and encourage active participation throughout the lesson.
- Adjust the pace according to students' understanding and engagement levels.
